Our Man in Bolivia! Dr Wayne Morris recently represented the Church of England at a convention organised by the World Council of Churches in La Paz, Bolivia. This was a consultation of theologians on the theme of Just and Inclusive Communities. It focussed on the concerns of four groups: people with disabilities, Dalit people from India, indigenous people and those combating racism. The agenda was to provide a theological vision for the WCC on Just and Inclusive communities and to develop processes and strategies to work towards that vision.
