- 1. Exhibits should be original and the sole work of the entrant; they should not have previously been exhibited at Christleton Shows.
- 2. Please pay $\pounds 1$ fee per exhibit when submitting your entry form.
- 3. Exhibitors are entitled to free admission in the afternoon.
- 4. Only <u>one entry per class</u>; except in Art, Textile Crafts and Other Crafts sections where two entries are allowed in each class.

N.B. Young people aged 12 and over can enter all classes in the Adult Section.

- Entry forms and money in a sealed envelope should be left at Drakes' Haircutters in Village Road, or given to Mrs Judith Butt, Greenmantle, Plough Lane, Christleton, or handed in at the Show gazebo on the village green in front of the Parish Hall on <u>Saturday 1st July between 10 – 12 noon.</u>
- 6. Late entries will be accepted on the day, but please help the organisers by entering early and bring non-perishable exhibits to the Hall on Friday evening.
- 7. Names of entrants should not be shown on entries if possible.
- 8. Exhibits are left at the owner's risk.
- 9. No communication is to be entered into with the judges.
- 10. The Show Committee tries to ensure that all judges are independent, are qualified in their subject, and are completely impartial.

Instructions

- 1. The Parish Hall will be open on Friday 7th July from <u>6.30 8pm</u>. All nonperishable exhibits should be delivered that evening.
- All other exhibits should be delivered to the Hall between <u>9 10am</u> on Saturday 8th July.
- 3. <u>Exhibits must be in by 10am</u> in order that judging can take place. The Hall will be closed for judging between 10am and 2pm.
- 4. The Show will take place between 2pm and 4.30pm. Admission: Adults £1, children free, exhibitors free. Refreshments and raffle.
- 5. The Prize giving will take place at 4pm, followed by the raffle, and exhibits must be collected at the end of the Show at approximately 4.30pm.
